Elementary course truck crane

It is important that the driver of a truck crane is able to meet high requirements in order to work safely and responsibly. Additionally, the employer has the obligation that he is able to prove that the driver of the truck crane is sufficiently educated according to the working conditions act. Therefore, the driver of a commercial vehicles with a truck crane or grapple bin need to have a valid certificate and safety pass.

This course focuses on the safety and responsibilities of working with the truck crane. At the end of the course, a practical assessment is taken. If the assessment is successfully completed, the participant will receive a certificate and a safety pass.

European Guideline Professional competence 2003/59

According to the European Guideline Professional competence 2003/59, it is obligatory for professional drivers to attend at least 35 hours of refreshing courses in 5 year time in order to maintain their Professional competences.
